

Canadian RNs Moving to Saskatchewan Checklist

- Create an account and complete the “Online Assessment for RN Eligibility with CRNS”**
 - General Contact, Employment and Education information,
 - English Proficiency: if English is not your primary language, or your nursing education was not delivered in English you will be prompted to upload a copy of the results from an English proficiency exam completed within the last 2 years,
 - List your current/past registrations (both nursing, and non-nursing) and confirm that you will have the verification of registration form(s) sent directly to SRNA,
 - Proof of ID: Upload photo/scan of photo ID, birth certificate +/- name change,
 - Vulnerable Sector Check (AKA Criminal Record Check) (Valid x6 months),
 - i. Pay the Money! Then upload photo/scan to submit with this application.
 - Practice Hours per year for the last 5 years,
 - **Continuing Competence** (Personal assessment, learning plan, feedback and evaluate),
 - i. Confirm whether or not you’ve completed it already.
 - ii. Must be completed annually, and prior to being granted licensure.
 - Sign your life away and... Pay the money! (\$157.50).

Additional Supporting Documents to be sent to the CRNS/uploaded to your account:

- Complete section A of the “**Verification of ORIGINAL Registration/Licensure**” form, then send it to the Canadian regulatory body with whom you were first registered, with instructions to complete section B and submit it directly to CRNS.
 - INTERNATIONALLY educated RNs: have a 2nd form submitted from the country where you completed your nursing education.
- Complete section A of the “**Verification of CURRENT/MOST RECENT Registration/Licensure**” form, then send it to your current/most recent regulatory body with instructions to complete section B and submit it directly to CRNS.
 - Pay the money! Regulatory/licensing bodies will usually charge a fee for this.
- Complete the “**Consent form to Obtain Employment Verification.**”
 - So CRNS can check your references (most recent nurse manager/supervisor).
- Complete the “**Hours of RN Employment**” form (hrs/year/employer from the last 5 years).
- If you are a RN in Canada, but have NEVER practiced in Canada, complete the “**Consent Form to Release Registration Information.**” (If you were able to complete the Hours of RN Employment form, you do not need to submit this one).
 - Include all Canadian jurisdictions you have applied for licensure & if it was granted.

Once your assessment has been approved, CRNS will email you the online “RN Initial Application for Licensure.”

- Pay the Money! (See **Fee Schedule**).
- Complete the “**Continuing Competence Program**” (annually).
