

Canadian RNs Moving to Newfoundland & Labrador Checklist

- Complete the web based “[Provisional Registration Application](#)” through “[MyCRNNL](#).”
 - Includes: General contact information, education details, current registration info, nursing experience data from the last 2 years, and a few yes/no questions.
 - Clear photo/scanned copy of: signed government photo ID (passport, drivers license), birth certificate and marriage/name change certificate if applicable.
 - Pay the money! (\$189.75).
- Complete section A of the “[Verification of Registration](#)” form, then send it to all registering/licensing authorities where you are currently registered.
 - Forms must be submitted to CRNNL directly from regulatory/licensing bodies after completing section B.
 - This process can take days, or weeks – so start well before you plan to move/work.
 - Pay the money! Regulatory/licensing bodies will usually charge a fee for this service.
- Complete section A of the “[Statement of Current/Most Recent Employer\(s\)](#)” form, then send it to your employer(s) from the last 5 years with instructions to return it directly to CRNNL via snail mail upon completion and must be officially sealed/stamped by the organization.
- Submit a “[Certificate of Conduct](#)” (aka Criminal Record Check) (valid x 6 months).
 - Pay the money! (typically)
 - Original copies must be mailed to CRNNL, unless using an online service where certificate will be directly emailed.
- [English Language Proficiency](#) - if needed.
 - Not needed if: your first language is English, you graduated from an English nursing program, you’ve been registered, living and working in an English environment over the last 2 years, or your employer will vouch for your English skills by sending CRNNL verification directly.
 - ELP test scores are valid x 2 years and official copy of test results must be sent directly to CRNNL by the testing company.
- Apply for licensure through “[MyCRNNL](#).”
 - Once your application for registration has been approved, CRNNL will email you with further instructions to complete before you can legally work including:
 - i. Pay the money! (See [Fee Schedule](#))
 - ii. Completion of the “[Continuing Competency Program](#)” (a self-assessment of learning needs, a learning plan, and an annual learning module).
 - iii. Completion of the Canadian Nurses Protective Society (CNPS) process for Professional Liability Protection (PLP) and Pay the Money! (\$68+HST).

FYI Facts:

No notarization needed.

Licensure year runs April 1st - March 31st, but annual renewal is due by March 1st.

Registration: \$412.47/yr → Prorated January 1st: \$127.40 PLUS the CNPS PLP fee (\$68+HST).

RNs wear white tops & black bottoms in NL; but also get \$155 annual uniform allowance (unless uniform provided).
